8. TEACHING

I have had a reduced teaching load during my first 12 months at UBC. I will be teaching **KIN 261: Health Policy and Society** (core KIN undergrad course with approximately 71 students, 3 x 50 minute lecture) and **KIN 464: Health Promotion and Physical Activity** (KIN upper level undergraduate course with approximately 180 students, 2 x 75 minute lecture) in Winter 2016. I previously taught KIN 261 as a sessional instructor while completing my PhD at UBC.

(a) *Areas of special interest and accomplishments*

My areas of teaching specialization include qualitative methods (particularly emerging 'digital' qualitative methods) and disability sport from a critical disabilities studies perspective. I have given guest lectures on both of these topics at UBC (KIN 161, 261, 381, 382, 383, 464, 571) and at Loughborough University (PSP003). I was also a guest instructor teaching qualitative methods in the 'Masters in Exercise and Health in Special Populations' course at the Universidade de Coimbra (Portugal) in 2014.

I have also led numerous workshops for graduate students, research staff and faculty members on the topics of 'digital skills for academics' and digital qualitative methods in sport research.

Though I have not yet had the opportunity to independently supervise graduate students, I have taken initiatives to gain experience in this area. While a Research Associate at Loughborough University I co-supervised a Master's student (Emma Norris) on her major paper exploring Paralympic athletes and retirement. I am currently acting as an 'advisor on qualitative methods' for a PhD student (Benjamin Stone) who is conducting research on racing wheelchair design at the Peter Harrison Centre for Disability Sport at Loughborough University. At UBC, I have been mentoring an M.Sc. student (Laura McCracken, supervisor: Chris West) to develop the qualitative aspect of her research.

9. SCHOLARLY AND PROFESSIONAL ACTIVITIES

(a) *Areas of special interest and accomplishments*

In addition to developing expertise in the topical area of Paralympic Sport and critical disability studies, I have a special interest in the 'emerging digital qualitative methods.' This includes, for example, exploring methods for conducting online ethnographies or the use of digital photographic and video material in qualitative project. In addition to the above listed workshops teaching digital qualitative methods, I am currently leading an initiative entitled 'Mobile Methods for Researching Bodies in Motion' funded by the Haagenson Fund (Faculty of Education – UBC). This initiative includes a virtual seminar series for graduate students and faculty in the School of Kinesiology exploring the use of digital platforms and tools in qualitative research projects and the creation of a 'lending library' of devices including iPads, GoPros, Fitbits and drones.

I am currently editing a book on digital methods for the series *Qualitative Methods in Sport and Exercise* to be published by Routledge in 2018.
